

PENNSYLVANIA MAP (1757-1765) showing forced march west taken by Jacob Hochstetler and his two sons after they were captured by Delaware and Shawnee Indians in September, 1757. Jacob was kept for seven months near Irvine, Pa. from where, in May, 1758, he escaped to begin his return east. One son spent six years with the Delaware near Meadville, Pa.
